- **Informational:** DEP has issued an extension for the superseding order of conditions for the Wayside Trail project (DEP 316-0744). The SOOC continues to April 12, 2025.
- **Informational:** DEP has notified all Conservation Commissions that due to a combination of unprecedented filing requests, staffing issues, and IT issues, there is a roughly 4 week delay in issuing DEP file numbers at this time.
- Informational: Massachusetts Association of Conservation Commissions (MACC) sent a letter informing members that FY23 dues will increase to \$597. FY22 dues were \$585. Dues will be invoiced in June.
- **Hardy Pond Association** (via Sally Wetzler) has submitted a testing report for the pond per the order of conditions on the 2020 herbicide application project. Sally requests assistance from the Commission in interpreting and understanding the test results.
- **187 Lexington Street:** Paul Finger has submitted a response to the Engineering Department's concerns about this property (discussed at the 11-18-2021 meeting). He is willing to meet with the Commission if requested.
- **200 Smith Street** ("muck pucks" inquiry): Cambridge Water has responded regarding this product and is unwilling to endorse its use without additional research. Matt Kuchins of Outdoor Pride thanks the Commission for their response. He has discovered that the property has a wetlands consultant, and will work with him regarding pond health issues.
