- I. Community Development Block Grant
  - A. Energy Audit for library
    - 1. Discussed features of free Eversource audit vs ASHRAE Level 2. Eversource is probably ASHRAE Level 1
    - 2. MEI library data will that be enough for Level 2
    - 3. Would Mayor fund an energy audit for library?
    - 4. What's the square footage of library?
    - 5. RISE Engineering needs Blueprints for mechanicals and electrical, 12 mos of utility bills, footprint of the building to RISE engineering.
