- 3. A request was received from the Mayor to approve the acceptance of a framed News Tribune article about the closing of Grover Cronin's department store from the Cincotta family for display in the City Hall Museum Room. Councillor Durkee moved to approve the acceptance of the donation and that the City Council send a thank you note to the donor. The motion was adopted on a voice vote.

8. A request was received from the Mayor to approve a financing transaction totaling \$1.3 million for a Water System Improvement project. This project consists of the cleaning and lining of water mains, repair and updating of water service lines and hydrants. Streets included in this project are Barbara Road, Elinor Circle, Hardy Pond Road, Hemlock Terrace, Kingston Road, Kingston Terrace, Mokema Avenue and Trinity Circle. This project was publicly bid on June 2, 2022 and the lowest responsible and responsive bidder was Dewcon Inc., of Basking Ridge, NJ with a price of \$1,278,325. Also included is a contingency of approximately 1.7%.
