MINUTES OF THE TRAFFIC COMMISSION MEETING HELD: JANUARY 15, 2015 AT 10:00 A.M. HENRY HOOVER COMMITTEE ROOM, CITY HALL

The Chair accepted a motion to accept the minutes of the previous meeting. Voted to accept December's minutes.

1. PETITIONED ITEMS:

A. 135 Second Avenue – Proposed Hotel Traffic Impact Study

VHB presented the traffic impact study for this project. Mr. Robert Nagi, VHB and proponent Mr. Ara Aftandilian attended summarized the proposed hotel at this location. A new seven story building with 138 rooms, extended stay, a small meeting room and a board room. The facility will provide a lounge option for their guests where light food items and beverages could be purchased. The site will be served by a single, relocated driveway along Second Avenue. The site will also provide 140 parking spaces for guests and staff. Level of Service (LOS) at 2nd Avenue and Winter Street is E in the PM and LOS A in the Am. The project is not expected to change the LOS in the area. A crosswalk, with possible easements will be installed, at a mutual agreed location on Second Avenue. Contribution to the infrastructure fund was stated to be \$100,000.

Member, Ms. Cagle asked for bicycle racks to be visible and a digital transportation board be installed with updated transport information. T.E. Mr. Garvin concurred with the report relative to trip estimates and a crosswalk.

Voted to forward the report to the City Council for their use in considering a Special Permit.

I. Taxicab Rules & Regulations, Article 21, Section 3, Subsection 4f and 4i (TC 12/14) **Voted off the table.**

Mr. Charles Frost, a Taxi Owner attended the meeting and was allowed to address the Commission relative to the age of a Taxi. He stated that he has two seven (7) year old vehicles and they are maintained in a safe condition. He also, intends to register a 10 year old vehicle that has 3,000 miles. In addition to appealing to the Commission, he has asked for assistance from Councilor Logan. Councilor Logan has requested an opinion from the Law Department concerning the Traffic Commission's authority for this regulation. Voted to table this item and place in the February agenda for a full discussion.
