We are respectfully asking for funds to support a low income senior housing rental subsidy program. This program would provide a rental subsidy to senior residents at or below 60% areawide median income or below \$43,440 annually for a single individual, and would allow them to afford the monthly rent at Leland Home.

We have considered both a restriction and voucher program. After consulting with the Waltham Housing Department, it was recommended that we begin with the voucher program until we find a permanent solution.

As a not-for-profit, Leland's mission has always been to be able to provide affordable senior living to the seniors of Waltham. With a subsidy program from the Waltham Community Preservation Committee, it would help significantly to continue to achieve this mission. Project Information

Low Income Senior Housing voucher program would provide a rental subsidy to senior residents at or below 60% area-wide median income or below \$43,440 annually for a single individual.

A designated Leland Home administrative would administer the program.

95% of the funds would be used to provide subsidy and 5% of funds to support administrative costs. 100% of the project funding would provide subsidy to eligible applicants at or below the 60% AMI.

Subsidy: A monthly subsidy that would allow for the applicant to afford the monthly rent, keep stipend of \$125 while reserve any assets.

Rent is established by using the budgeted rental cost of room and board as determined by Leland Home expenses. Subsidy payment would be made directly to Leland Home.

Current Leland Home senior living at an affordable price

The Leland Home is a non-profit rest home providing retirement living to seniors since 1892. It has room for 38 residents, is staffed by a responsible person 24 hours a day. Rooms equipped with half bath.

For monthly rent of \$5,252.00, Residents enjoy the following services:

- •Three meals each day
- •Medication management assistance and pharmacy program
- •Assistance with bath or shower and hairdresser (once a week)
- •Weekly laundry and linen service (laundry done individually)
- Other minor services

Current subsidized Options for Residential Care (Level IV Rest Home) for those eligible:

- 1. EAEDC (Emergency Aid to the Elderly, Disabled and Children)
- Eligibility:
- ·Monthly income must be between \$1034.00 and \$3,104.70
- ·No More than \$249.99 in assets
- .Stipend of \$72.80
- Subsidized amount of 102.58 a day
- 2. SSI/SSP (Supplemental Security Income/Supplemental State Program)

Eligibility:

- ·Monthly income must be less than \$1034.00
- ·No more than \$2,000.00 in assets
- .Stipend of \$72.80
- .Subsidized amount of \$102.87 a day

Residents must be at least 62 years of age and must be able to meet the financial requirements necessary for residency or be eligible for state subsidized programs.

Total \$820,827

100% of all CPS funds will be used to provide rental subsidy to Waltham Seniors at or below 60% AMI. The Leland Home would staff administration of the program.

\$820,827 budget would fund annual rent for five rooms for three years and provide Waltham senior residents with a rental subsidy.

The Administrative Assistant would administer the funding:

Income determinations Maintain budget Maintain wait list

Proof of Financing

The Senior Based Rental Assistance Program would be funded with CPA funds only. We are applying for \$820,827.

It will be administered by Leland Home administrative designee. Will maintain a waiting list if needed.

SECTION VI

Goals

The goal of the low income senior housing voucher program is to provide assistance to the Waltham Seniors at or below low to moderate income or 60% of AMI. Based on Leland Home census, there are 33 occupied units in Leland Home based 38 units in the Leland Home. The census indicates a need for assistance for Waltham senior residents in the low to moderate income levels or 60% AMI. This includes assistance for seniors only.

COMMUNITY NEED

Community has a need for elderly/disabled housing especially for individuals who fall in the category of low income, 60% AMI. Waltham Housing Authority has three programs: 1) state program funded by DHCD, 2) twenty room congregate house funded by DHCD, and 3) federal public housing elderly/disabled individuals on HUD. The state program housing waitlist is greater than three years. The federal program has a wait list greater than five years.
