

# Questions and Answers about Residential Energy Efficiency for Waltham Residents

Where should I begin if I want to make my home or apartment more energy efficient and save money?

A professional energy audit of your residence is available for **FREE**, and will include a detailed inspection and suggested actions that will save you energy and money. **MassSave** provides free state-wide energy audit service. This is where you should begin the process – and utility funding incentives require this. A MassSave telephone representative will ask you a few simple questions about your residence and your income. MassSave will schedule an appointment for a professional energy auditor to visit your home and look from top to bottom for cost-effective ways to save energy. The MassSave auditor will inform you about financial incentives that can substantially reduce or even eliminate the cost of making the recommended energy-saving improvements. Renters will be asked to get written approval of their landlord prior to the audit.

## What Utility Financial Incentives are Available to Households in Waltham?

See the table below to see what utility incentives are applicable to your needs. Please note that some incentives will vary based on the type of fuel you use to heat your home. The table is divided into incentives that are the same across all heating fuels, and those specific to gas heating customers, and customer who heat with other fuels such as oil/electric/propane.

#### What Incentives are there to Convert to Gas Heat?

### What State and Federal Tax Credits are there and how do they Work?

Until December 31, 2010, Federal tax provisions provide tax credits of 30% of eligible efficiency investments, up to \$1,500 per year for a primary residence that is an existing home, and not a rental unit.

### Are There Loan Programs that Can Help Finance Energy Efficiency Measures?

**Yes!** After you receive a MassSave audit of your residence, you will be provided with an application form for the "**HEAT Loan Program**" which offers **0% loans of between \$2,000 and \$15,000 for terms of up to 7 years!** The MassSave auditor will indicate on the form the measures for which your home is eligible for a HEAT loan, such as insulation and air sealing upgrades, duct sealing and insulation, heating system replacement, hot water system replacement, Energy Star thermostats, and Energy Star windows.
