- 1. FWG member orgs and process (public meetings, drafts and redrafts) to include various shared interests. {WLT, WATCH.CDC, LWV, WFCF}
- 2. Our principles for going forward: reuse what is feasible*, reduce impervious areas, link to public transit, create jobs for residents of rehab and new spaces, new construction must be green for long-term economic sustainability.
- * Howe Library (57/21), Howe Hall (75/41), Hillside Cottage (47/43), Warren Hall (29/11), Kelly (51/100), and Food Service (54/40). The numbers in (.../...) refer to the numbers on the four-color map (Marie's map) and the corresponding DCAM numbers.

The rationale for these is that they have a supportive constituency (Friends of Howe Library), they have been fairly recently used, renovated, and do not have asbestos.

- 3. Timelines depend on availability of funding and creativity of proposals. For example, any number of performing arts organizations could provide sweat equity for free use of space in Howe Hall. A food service company would renovate building 54/40 and employ local trades to do that while hiring workers for operation of their service for schools, nursing homes, meals on wheels, et al.
- 4. Green construction includes materials that are energy efficient, recycled, low maintenence, and employs available on-site energy sources. New construction is planned to consider job-creation on-site and transit improvements
