- 9. Liaison & Subcommittee Report
- 1. Fernald- Baldwin cottage site visit Tuesday, June 18, 2019 at noon.
- 2. CPC Wellington Farm Fields restoration clearing of tree removal, planting and restoring stonewalls. Restore the land back to the original farming fields. This application was approved at the CPC. Anything to do with the Stonewalls should come before the WHC. The WHC needs to clarify if the fields are considered "historic" or do they fall under the care of Park and Rec. Since historic is checked on the application, the parties involved should come before the WHC and explain/present the project.

Chimneys at Francis Cabot Lowell Mill are in disrepair need to be fixed and many letters of support have come in favor of this project, Jack Cox was one of those supporters.

- 3. Historic Inventory- Last fall we surveyed the Mass Central Railroad from Market Basket to Beaver St. looking for artifacts etc. to document and evaluate. The artifacts were characterized to be left in place, or leave in place if not in the way. We don't want the construction company to remove the artifacts while working on the cleanup of the areas.

11. New Business

a. Discussion of City Hall Windows & Doors Summary: Ernie Vazquez, CGKV Architects, Inc. 204A Hampshire St. Cambridge, MA Working on city hall to replace the doors, windows, the cupola and put sprinklers inside the building. As far as historical, we are going to be looking at the windows and doors. Our idea is to replicate this as close to the original as possible. Re-use the metal grills from the original doors and incorporate them into the new doors. Keep as much of the interior trim as possible. We would be using aluminum windows, and solid wood doors. The architect will send the commission pictures of the original windows along with pictures of the replacement windows so the commission can get an idea of the look.

- b. Discussion of bylaws, and including the word "calendar" days, to clarify. Any place that states the word days, pertaining to days and time lines the word "calendar" should appear before it.
- c. 40 Charles St was granted emergency demolition as deemed an unsafe structure. The commission did support the demolition of the property as it was a safety hazard to the public.
