

Resolution

Concerning Acquisition of the Arrigo Farm

May 13,2013

WHEREAS...The Arrigo Farm on Warren Street is comprised of three parcels of land:

- a 4.055 acre parcel (ID R055 002 0027) located at 342-344 Warren Street in Waltham
- a 0.157 acre parcel (ID R055 002 0028) located at 25 After Wilton Street in Waltham
- a 0.005 acre parcel (ID 530 16 0) located on Belmont Street in Watertown for a total acreage of 4.217 acres, and

WHEREAS... The Arrigo Farm was one of the last private run family farms in Waltham, and

WHEREAS...The Arrigo Farm is one of the oldest continuously operated farms in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts and in the country, having been farmed continuously since at least 1650, if not earlier, when Waltham was part of Watertown, 126 years before the founding of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS...The various occupants over its 363-year history have been representatives of the great social and political changes in our community: the establishment of the Puritan theocracy at Watertown, the formation of Waltham, the local contributions to the American Revolution including the Battle of Bunker Hill, the participation in the 18th century maritime trade, the support of the Union in the Civil War, the diminishing Yankee presence in an increasingly industrial and immigrant community, the continuation of local agriculture by 20th century Italian immigrants, and

WHEREAS...The Arrigo farm represents the city's long agricultural legacy of family farms including generations of market gardeners and Waltham's many immigrant family farmers, and

WHEREAS...The Massachusetts Historic Commission reports that the central portion of the Barnes 1837 farmhouse, with its gable roofed structure, is representative of Federal style, which meets criteria for the National Register of Historic Landmarks, and

WHEREAS...The Arrigo farm fields are classified as Prime Agricultural Soil, identified as containing Merrimac fine sandy loam, and

WHEREAS... Locally grown produce is good for our community in many diverse ways, as local food promotes energy conservation, local food supports local farmers, local food preserves open space, local food is more nutritious, and local food simply tastes better;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED... That the Waltham City Council sponsor a CPC application to acquire the 4+ acre Arrigo farm under open space and historical purposes, for the ultimate purpose of leasing the farmland for local farming, preserving one of the last vestiges of local family farming, to benefit current and future generations of Waltham inhabitants.
