What is food waste composting?

Food waste composting is an alternative way to dispose of your business's food waste. A compost hauler comes to your business one or more times a week and collects your food waste. This food waste, instead of going to a landfill or combustion facility, goes to a composting facility, where it is combined with yard waste and it decomposes to form a rich soil for gardening and landscaping.

Working with a compost hauler is a great way for your business to save money on waste disposal costs!

The compost hauling company will work with your business to set up a system for separating out food waste. They provide compostable liners, as well as toters to store the food waste until pick-up.

How can I save money?

By having your food waste picked up by a compost hauler, you can greatly reduce your costs for trash hauling. Food waste is one of the heaviest types of materials in trash. So, by removing food waste from your regular trash, you will lower the weight of the trash you have to pay to have picked up.

The costs of hiring the compost hauler will depend upon several factors, including the size of your business and quantity of food waste produced, and it also varies by the company you choose to work with. To find out what your cost savings will be, you will have to compare your savings on trash hauling with the cost of compost pick-ups.

Benefits of composting your food waste

Composting is the most efficient way to deal with food waste. Putting waste into a landfill or a combustion facility strains our waste system, and also releases major greenhouse gases, including methane and carbon dioxide, into the air.

When food waste is brought to a composting facility, it is mixed with yard waste and allowed to decompose until it forms fertile compost that can be used for gardening and landscaping. This process conserves natural resources by returning valuable nutrients to the soil, and it conserves water by forming soils that retain moisture better.
