5	hear from the Clerk reading Case 2016-41, Colbea
6	Enterprise, 65 Main Street.
7	MARK HICKERNELL: (The Clerk reads the
8	above-mentioned petition into the record. See
9	Attached.)
10	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: Thank you.
11	May we hear from the Petitioner or the
12	Petitioner's representative please?
13	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: Thank you,
14	Madam Chair, members of the Board. My name is Bill
15	Proia. I'm here for the applicant tonight.
16	We had submitted a request for a
17	continuance anyway. And now that there are only four
18	members, we'd want to reiterate that. And so we had
19	submitted a letter. Should I read it?
20	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: Please do, into
21	the record, yes.
22	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: (Attorney

Proia reads request for continuance into the record.

1	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: So, do you have
2	another meeting planned with the neighbors?
3	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: We don't.
4	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: Okay.
5	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: And that's
6	the reason, one of the reasons, why we'd like to see
7	a countable extension because what we want to do, and
8	what we really owe the neighborhood, is to revise the
9	plan and give them adequate notice. We want to give
10	them a week or a couple of weeks, ten days, at least
11	a week.
12	We have some email addresses, but we
13	don't have everyone's email address so we will do a
14	mail notice as well as we did for the December $1^{\rm st}$
15	hearing. So, in order to get all that done, I think
16	we're hoping for the end of February or the beginning
17	of March so we'll have enough time to do all that.
18	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: Tell me you
19	say that improvements may be possible. Have you come
20	some way with the neighbors?
21	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: I haven't met
22	with the neighbors directly, but the ownership has.
23	And I've been told that there's some progress, but
24	there's still ongoing discussions. And we really

1	need to again, we owe them something on paper to
2	look at. So even though there's discussions about
3	why, you know, what changes we can make, which
4	variances we can probably get away with, changing the
5	massing of the site, and maybe some flow of traffic
6	and things like that. It's hard for them to commit
7	to anything, meaning the neighbors, until they see it
8	on paper. So, it really isn't fair, again, until we
9	show them something that they can react to.
10	BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: All right.
11	Especially where you say additional improvements may
12	be possible, they would have a say in what
13	improvements.
14	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: Yeah, I mean
15	we've come up with some conceptual plans as a team
16	and we've looked at them, and they just haven't been
17	adequate, in my opinion. So, we've sent the
18	designers back to the drawing board.
19	The additional improvements I mean are
20	ones we think we can still make to the project that

BARBARA RANDO, CHAIR: Mr. Sergi, do

1	JOHN SERGI: What's the primary
2	concern of the neighborhood?
3	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: It's the
4	proximity of the building to the abutting residential
5	land, the scale of the new building. It's much
6	bigger than the existing building, frankly. There's
7	a programmatic design, meaning the building that
8	they're using here they tried to use in other spots,
9	and it may not be suitable for this location. So,
10	it's going back to the drawing board. It's higher.
11	It has a peak roof. It's a nicer building, but it's
12	a challenging site and the building is too big for
13	the site.
14	JOHN SERGI: So, you want to conform
15	it into the neighborhood, something like that?
16	ATTORNEY WILLIAM PROIA: Yeah, and
17	we've gotten some feedback about our traffic and
18	turns out of the site onto Barbara Road that we're
19	trying to improve maybe with some curbing that will
20	force people to only go left. Even though there's an
21	only left rule, it's a straight out intersection now
22	so people tend to cheat a little bit. So, if we can
23	maybe reconfigure those curbs you've seen them
24	before so just a left out would be really

L7	really happy about what was being presented at that
18	December 1 <sup>st</sup> neighborhood meeting. And, through you,
L9	our representative, if there's a way to give at least
20	ten days' notice for a neighborhood meeting in that
21	we can notify people the same way. Mr. Proia has
22	also been very good at he started a distribution
23	list for email. I've worked with him to try to build
