The Waltham Cultural Council Announce 2021 Grantees



For Immediate Release: LOCAL GRANTS AWARDED FOR WALTHAM

**Waltham, March 10th, 2021** - The Waltham Cultural Council announce the award of 45 grants totaling \$54,257 for cultural programs in Waltham. This year we received a record 66 applications requesting a total of \$172,156. A complete list of this year's recipients can be found below.

The Waltham Cultural Council is part of a network of 329 Local Cultural Councils serving all 351 cities and towns in the Commonwealth. The LCC Program is the largest grassroots cultural funding network in the nation, supporting thousands of community-based projects in the arts, sciences, and humanities every year. The state legislature provides an annual appropriation to the Mass Cultural Council, a state agency, which then allocates funds to each community.

Decisions about which activities to support are made at the community level by a board of municipally appointed volunteers. The members of the Waltham Cultural Council are: Rosemary Harbeson, Carolyn Melbye, Elizabeth Moy, Sharyn Nolan, Eileen Peng, Brad Pielech, Scott Schurr, and Consuelo Valdes.

In response to this year's Community Input Survey, 65% of community members voiced a strong desire for publicly funded cultural projects to be specifically aimed at our teen population. In an effort to ensure programs and events supported with WCC grant funds match the interest of our diverse community of teens, we launched a Teen Advisory Group to help review applications and provide vital feedback. The council thanks this year's teen

advisors, Emily Lin and Delanie Pon. Both Juniors at Waltham High School, Emily and Delanie provided invaluable insight during the review process.

Statewide, more than \$4 million will be distributed by local cultural councils in 2021. Grants will support an enormous range of grass-roots activities: concerts, exhibitions, radio, and video productions, field trips for schoolchildren, after-school youth programs, writing workshops, historical preservation efforts, lectures, First Night celebrations, nature and science education programs for families, and town festivals. Nearly half of LCC funds support educational activities for young people.
